








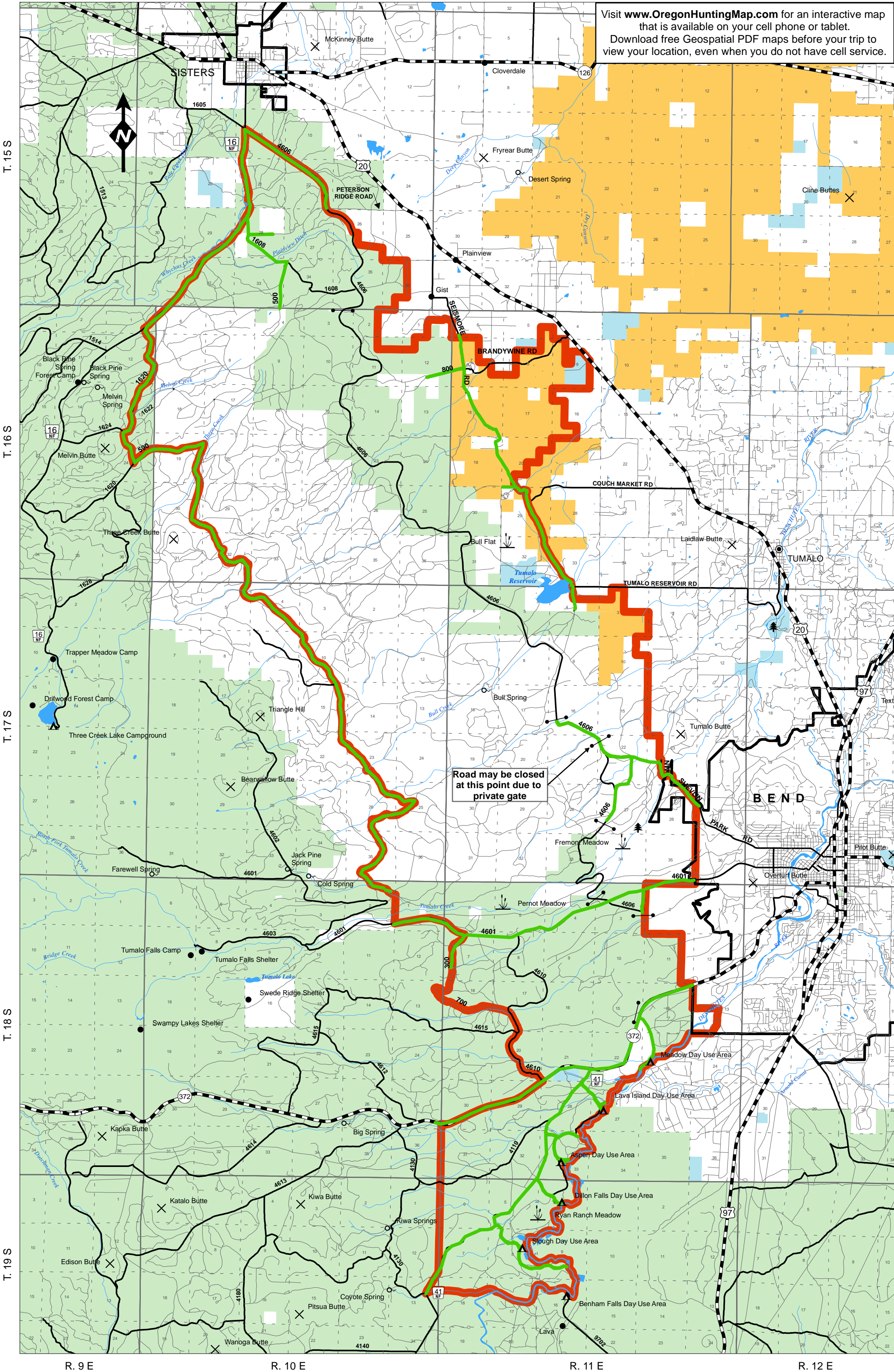
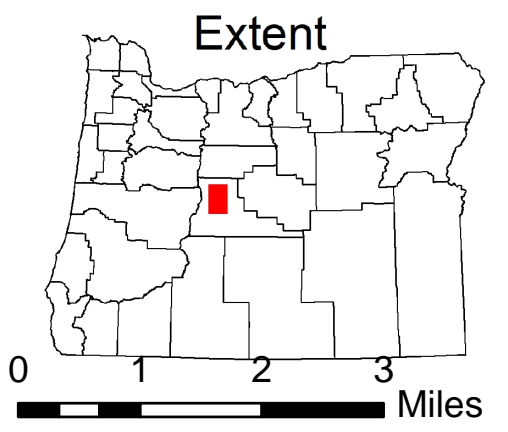

December 1 through March 31

Special permits may be obtained for legitimate reasons. Private landowners and employees are permitted access to their lands. Federal, State and County employees are permitted entry in performance of official duties.

Not all roads indicated in green are open to OHV travel. Please check U.S. Forest Service OHV regulations for roads specifically open to OHV travel on the National Forest Motor Vehicle Use Map (MVUM).
